10 Tips for Human Rights Action

- 1. DEBATES: Are there rights issues that you that you know of or have been mentioned in the comic that you feel particularly strong about? Think of a motion, organize two teams and get debating. This will enable you to get different views on the particular issue while all the lping appreciate the other people's perspectives.
- 2. EXHIBITIONS: Organize an art contest in your school or community in which the contestaring will depict the key human rights issues/violations in your community. Have these displayed in your local social hall, church/mosque or school and ask participants to pick the best. You can, if possible, have these framed and displayed in local schools or offices.
- 3. A HUMAN-RIGHTS ZONE: Declare your school, home or local area a 'human rights zone'.

 Make sure that everyone within it respects people's rights and knows what their rights are.
- 4. DRAMA: Staging plays is a great way of informing people while at the same time entertaining them usually called 'edutainment'. You can organize to stage plays showing how rights are violated and how this could be stopped. Invite members of your community to watch such plays and ask them to make comments about the issues that you raise.
- 5. HUMAN-RIGHTS AWARDS: Find out who has been doing great work promoting and protecting rights in your area and present them with an award. Invite everyone to witness the award giving ceremony, including the media.
- 6. A HUMAN RIGHTS FAIR: Organize speakers to give informative speeches on various issues of human rights.
- 7. LETTER WRITING: Write to Kenya Human Rights Commission and find out how you can help them with their Rapid Response Campaigns.
- 8. DEFENDING HUMAN RIGHTS: Write letters to the editors of the national and local newspapers about what you think about various issues of human rights. Report human rights violations giving full details of what the violation is, who it happened to, who did it, when and under what circumstances and send this to either the local newspapers or to Kenya Human Rights Commission.
- 9. SONG, DANCE AND CHORAL VERSES: compose any of these and ask to make presentations during key functions in your community or schools such as during parents day, open days or during national/international days such as November 20th International Children's Day or December 10th Human Right's Day.
- 10. VISITS: Organize to visit juvenile homes to talk to children in such homes about human rights issues.
